

Man Suspected Of Fatal Stabbing Still On The Lam

(CBS) NORTHRIDGE, Calif. One of two suspects being sought for the fatal stabbing of a Northridge man in a Porter Ranch park was in custody Wednesday, police announced.

Quinn Marez, 18, was arrested Tuesday night and booked for murder in the death of Daniel Edward Koch, 33, who was attacked about 1 p.m. Aug. 26 in Limekiln Canyon Park, said Los Angeles police Detective Michael Fesperman of the Devonshire Station.

Marez was being held in lieu of \$1 million bail, according to the sheriff's department.

On Friday, police publicly named Marez and Justin Thalheimer, also 18, as suspects in the crime. Both young men were acquaintances of the victim, police said.

Koch's family described him as a free spirit and artist who lived in the park and painted. He was a fixture in the park, known by many people, they said.

"Danny's passion was art and the great outdoors and he was at the park drawing art, his passion," Koch's brother, John, said earlier. "Whoever did this needs to be brought to justice."

Anyone knowing the whereabouts of Thalheimer was urged to call police.
